In 2016, Operation Catnip, SPCA of Franklin County and Franklin County Animal Shelter joined to create the Franklin County Community Cat Coalition. The Coalition goal is to leverage low cost spay/neuter veterinary services and Operation Catnip's free MASH-style TNVR clinics. In Year One of the newly implemented project, Animal Control Officers and Franklin County Animal Shelter staff were trained to discuss TNVR as an alternative to shelter intake and are now actively discussing the option in the field. SPCA of Franklin County assisted with community education and with trapping and transport of community cats to an Operation Catnip partner veterinarian or to an Operation Catnip MASH-style clinic. As a result, 300 free-roaming cats were spayed or neutered, vaccinated (distemper and rabies), and returned to field in 2016.

Save Rates* increased from 27% in 2015 to 34% in 2016 and Euthanasia** decreased from 73% to 64%. This work was made possible by multiple grant funders.

*Save Rate is defined as the number of (cats adopted + cats transferred to rescue + cats redeemed) / total cat intake

** Euthanasia is defined as cats euthanized / total cat intake and does not include cats that died in care
